Club Treasurer extraordinaire, Andy, spoke passionately about the status of the Club's operating finances as well as the performance of the Club's trust funds. With Rotarians hanging on every word spoken by a man who clearly loves numbers, Andy reported "all is well." The Cub operating account is beating the budget in a good way. Grants from trust funds are on track to meet or marginally exceed the 2017-2018 grant budget.
